Modal Verbs of Politeness

- When asking questions, we can use **modal verbs**. For example:
 - May I...
 - Would you...
 - Would you mind...
- Could you...
- Will you..
- Can you...









"May I borrow your shoes?"









"Could you close the door, please?" "Would you mind closing the door, please?"

We do **not** use the word "may" in a polite question when "you" is the subject.

Example: May you please close the door? X **Could** you please close the door? ✓

The word "please" makes the request more polite and less direct. In some cultures, visitors are expected to ask for help politely, using "please."


